UPDATES AND AWARDS

Apply for 2023 publication of the year award

Applicantions for publication of the year are now open. The award is to recognise the best original research article published in **2023** in the field of biomechanics with an ANZSB member as the first author. <u>Apply now</u>.

Guidelines:

- The Applicant (i.e. 1st Author) must be a financial member of ANZSB at the time of application.
- The original research paper must have been published (not accepted) in 2023.
- Applicant can only submit one paper
- The paper will be judged upon the following criteria: research quality, significance and innovation, and quality of the journal.

Guidelines:

- ANZSB members who are currently enrolled in a biomechanics-related research higher degree are eligible for the Student Award.
- Student applicants also require that a research supervisor (primary or associate) is a member of ANZSB.
- ANZSB members who are no more than 10 years post-PhD (including approved extensions due to career disruptions) are eligible for the Early-Mid Career Academic (EMCA) Award.
- Applicants must be the presenting author and attend the conference.
- Applicants must acknowledge support from ANZSB in their presentation.
- Applicants must be willing to write a review of the conference for an ANZSB newsletter.

To access these newsletters, members are required to create a log-in and register for website members access.

NOMINATIONS FOR ANZSB EXECUTIVE

Nominations for the following positions on the ANZSB executive are now invited:

- **President-Elect**: The role of President-Elect provides an opportunity for mid-to-late career members to gain experience on the Executive Committee prior to taking on the President role.
- **Secretary/Treasurer**: The Secretary/Treasurer maintains The Society's membership list, handles official correspondence for The Society, maintains The Society's financial accounts, and provides an annual audited statement of accounts.
- Communications Officer: The Communications Officer produces regular newsletters to maintain links between members of The Society, liaises with the Secretary/Treasurer regarding sponsorship of The Society through its newsletter, contributes to the promotion of the Society and management of The Society's electronic platforms (e.g. website, Facebook, X accounts).
- **Student Representative**: The Student Representative represents the interests of student members of The Society and organises a meeting of student members at ANZSB conferences. The student representative must be a student at the time they are appointed to the position.
- Early Career Researcher (ECR) Representative. The Early Career Researcher Representative facilitates communication between ECRs and the executive committee, promotes networking between ECRs at conferences, and organises ECR professional development opportunities.

Each committee member is expected to serve for the period between consecutive ANZSB conferences (usually two years, maximum three years). Appointments will take effect from the next ANZSB conference (December 2024). Current members of the executive may renominate.

Nominees must be members of ANZSB. The student representative must be a student at the time they are appointed to the position. The ECR Representative must be within 10 years of the conferral of their PhD, although career interruptions will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

If you would like to nominate yourself for one of these positions please send a short biographical paragraph (maximum 250 words) about yourself together with a photo to the Past President, Peter Pivonoka (peter.pivonka@qut.edu.au) with the subject "ANZSB executive nomination". If there is more than one nominee for any of the positions, an election will be held. Nominations are due by August 16, 2024.

The new Executive Committee will be announced at the end of this year. If you have any queries about nomination, feel free to contact <u>Peter Pivonka</u> or <u>Karen Mickle</u>.
